Every action sentence has someone *DOING* (Subject), an action (Verb), and something the action *HAPPENS TO* (Object).

<i>Who does it?</i>	<i>What is the action?</i>	<i>What does it happen to?</i>

Worked Examples

Sentence	Subject (S)	Verb (V)	Object (O)
<i>The dog chased the cat.</i>	The dog	chased	the cat
<i>Sam kicked the ball.</i>	Sam	kicked	the ball
<i>The girl ate her dinner.</i>	The girl	ate	her dinner
